The Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC)

This **Convention** requires governments all around the world to think about the needs of young people and to consult them about matters that affect them, such as education, family life, law and order. Millions of young people do not have relatives to look after them: those caught up in civil wars in Africa, for instance. The CRC recognises this and says that young people must have rights of their own – rights that don't depend on parents or other adults.



There are still 250 000 children serving as soldiers around the world. The CRC states that 'Governments should not allow children under 15 to join the army.'
