# **Connect**

Students discuss the following questions:

- What has stuck in your mind from the lesson about the changing UK population (or previous lesson)? What about another pupil?
- How would the British public react if the government banned immigration to the UK?

## **Activate**

#### Worksheet 1.5a: Factors affected by immigration

- As a class, read Olive's opinions on immigration.
- Students highlight in blue any social factors she mentions and in red any economic factors she mentions.
- **Extra support:** certain students highlight only **two** social factors and **two** economic factors.
- Paired discussion: students work in pairs to discuss: Why do the effects of immigration need to be considered at both an individual and a whole-country level?

# **Demonstrate**

Worksheet 1.5b: Presentation on the benefits and challenges of immigration

- **Small-group activity:** students prepare a short presentation, focusing on: *Why is immigration seen as both a benefit and a challenge?* They should use the worksheet to prepare, guided by the success criteria.
- Students should pay attention and be prepared to carry out peer assessment after all the presentations have been given.

# **Consolidate**

Worksheet 1.5b: Presentation on the benefits and challenges of immigration

- Group activity: students peer assess the presentations, referring to the success criteria and completing the points table.
- Add up the points. Which group won?
- Ask the rest of the class: What did you learn from the winning presentation?

## Extra challenge

Ask more able students: Why would a lot of British bosses lose out if they could no longer employ immigrants?
