Instructions for how to use your independent learning

- •Seek help from your teacher if you find the task challenging and collaborate with classmates for group study sessions.


How to research and learn independently:



- •Optional: draw a simple diagram or describe how you want the song to sound (e.g. "big build before the chorus").

5. Recording Practice

- •Record yourself (or a partner) singing or playing **one section** of the carol (e.g. first verse).
- •Focus on clear timing and expression.
- •If you don't have access to equipment, rehearse the section and write a short reflection on how it went.

6. Arrangement Development

- Using a DAW (e.g. BandLab, GarageBand, Soundtrap), start arranging your track:
 - Import beats/instrumentation/Add vocals or instrumental parts/Make sure sections are in the correct order.

Experiment with at least two of the following effects in your DAW:

Reverb, EQ, Delay, Panning, Compression

Write down what you changed and why (e.g. "I added reverb to the vocals to make them sound more spacious").
