Instructions for how to use your independent learning

After school, every day, you should independently research and learn **TWO** subjects from your independent learning. Your class teacher may set you specific tasks. It doesn't matter if you don't have that particular subject on that day, just follow the timetable for your home learning. You should spend **half an hou**r on each subject.

- •Seek help from your teacher if you find the task challenging and collaborate with classmates for group study sessions.


How to research and learn independently:

- •Take notes write down important points, quotes or data.
- Ask someone to test you and ask you questions about the topic
- Create mind maps or flashcards on the topic
- •Try writing out the key words or vocabulary into new sentences
- Create a mnemonic
- •Draw a diagram of the process
- •Read further around the subject
