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A-Level Sociology (AQA) helps you make sense of the society you live in, how institutions work, why inequalities exist, and how people's identities are shaped. It is a subject built on questioning, debating, and looking beneath the surface of everyday life.

You will explore key areas like Education, Families, Beliefs, and Crime and Deviance, using real world examples and current issues. Expect activities such as mini-debates and research projects that bring the subject to life and build your analytical skills.
